

The Cleveland Orchestra unveils its 2025–26 digital season on Adella with six *Live from Severance* broadcasts and eight new premieres



CLEVELAND — The Cleveland Orchestra unveiled its 2025–26 digital season on <u>Adella</u>, its streaming platform and online home for concerts and original content.

Running September 2025 through July 2026, the new digital season brings audiences closer to the Orchestra than ever before, with six *Live from Severance* performances broadcast in real time from Mandel Concert Hall at Severance Music Center. In addition, Adella will premiere eight new digital programs, featuring recent concert recordings alongside behind-the-scenes feature stories and conversations with Music Director Franz Welser-Möst and guest artists such as Esa-Pekka Salonen, Senja Rummukainen, David Robertson, Marc-André Hamelin, Osmo Vänskä, and others.

Subscribers can also continue to enjoy Adella's growing library of digital concerts, fresh audio recordings, documentaries, educational videos, and archival treasures from the Orchestra's rich history.

The 2025–26 digital season kicks off on **Sunday, September 28**, at **3 p.m. EST** with a live broadcast of the Orchestra's opening weekend performance. The program features Music Director **Franz Welser-Möst** leading the US premiere of *Urworte* by the Orchestra's former Daniel R. Lewis Composer Fellow **Bernd Richard Deutsch**, as well as Salome's Dance from *Salome* by Richard Strauss and Ravel's *Boléro*, marking the 150th anniversary of the composer's birth.

Subsequent livestreams feature **Dalia Stasevska** leading Dvořák's "New World" Symphony alongside Revueltas's *La Noche de los Mayas*; **Franz Welser-Möst** pairing Mozart's "Jupiter" Symphony with Shostakovich's Symphony No. 11 in a preview of the Orchestra's concert at Carnegie Hall in January; **John Adams** conducting his own work, *Frenzy*, alongside music by Ives, Timo Andres, and Piazzolla, with pianist **Aaron Diehl**; **Elim Chan** and violinist **Patricia Kopatchinskaja** in Bartók's First Violin Concerto and *Dance Suite*; and **Daniel Harding** conducting Britten's monumental *War Requiem* with The Cleveland Orchestra Chorus and Children's Chorus.

Through both Adella and a growing number of partnerships with leading classical streaming platforms such as medici.tv, Marquee TV, Deutsche Grammophon's Stage+, symphony.live, and Apple Music Classical, The Cleveland Orchestra continues to extend its global reach, offering audiences everywhere greater access to its performances and a window into the music-making taking place at Severance Music Center each week.

About The Cleveland Orchestra

The Cleveland Orchestra, under the leadership of Music Director Franz Welser-Möst since 2002, is one of the most sought-after performing ensembles in the world. Year after year, the ensemble exemplifies extraordinary artistic excellence, creative programming, and community engagement. *The New York Times* has called Cleveland "the best in America" for its virtuosity, elegance of sound, variety of color, and chamber-like musical cohesion.

Founded by Adella Prentiss Hughes, the Orchestra performed its inaugural concert in December 1918. By the middle of the century, decades of growth and sustained support made it one of the most admired globally. The past decade has seen an increasing number of young people attending concerts, bringing fresh attention to The Cleveland Orchestra's legendary sound and committed programming.

The 2025–26 season marks Welser-Möst's 24th year as music director, a period in which The Cleveland Orchestra earned unprecedented acclaim around the world, including a series of residencies at the Musikverein in Vienna, the first of its kind by an American orchestra, and a number of acclaimed opera presentations.
