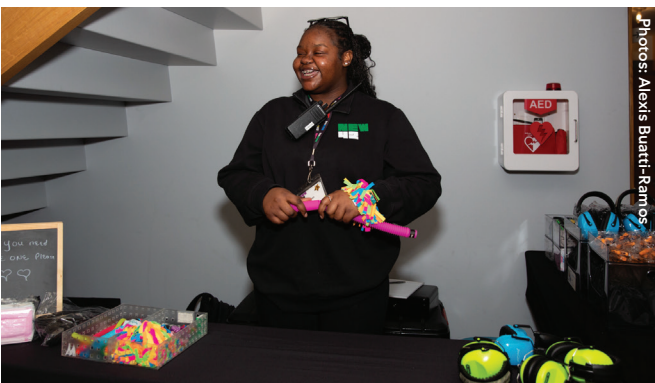


NEW VICTORY Accessibility Table ♦

Located downstairs across from the lockers, the Accessibility Table offers a number of support items free of charge, including:

- Sensory fidgets
- Assistive listening devices*
- Foam earplugs
- Induction neckloops*
- Ear defenders*
- Bariatric or standard wheelchairs*
- Audio description (AD) devices*
- Light-sensitivity sunglasses*

**These support items require an exchange of a government-issued ID, which is given back when the item is returned.*

Accessibility Services at Every Performance

Select Performances with Accessibility Services

For Patrons Who Are Blind or Have Low Vision ••••• **AD** Audio-Described Performances

◆ Seats designated for patrons who are blind or have low vision are available for purchase at each performance. Please contact Ticket Services to purchase or review additional access needs.

◆ Starting 10 minutes before these select performances, professional audio describers give verbal descriptions of the characters, costumes and design elements. Once the show begins, they narrate the live action between the actors' dialogue.

Audio description (AD) devices are available free of charge, cleaned after each use and may be used in any seat. To borrow one, visit the Accessibility Table in the lower lobby.



For Patrons Who Are d/Deaf, Hard of Hearing or Experience Hearing Loss •••••

◆ Assistive listening devices are free of charge, cleaned after each use and may be used in any seat. To borrow one, please visit the Accessibility Table in the lower lobby or speak to a House Manager or usher when you arrive.



Sign-Interpreted Performances

◆ In partnership with Hands On, select performances of every production in our season are interpreted in American Sign Language (ASL) by professional interpreters near the stage.



For Patrons with Mobility Aids

◆ The New Victory Theater and New 42 Studios are wheelchair-accessible and offer a variety of accommodations, including wheelchair-accessible seats with accompanying companion seats and designated aisle seats with raisable armrests. Venues also have several locations where patrons may sit down before they arrive at their seat.



For Patrons Accompanied by a Trained Service Dog

◆ We welcome guests with disabilities who are accompanied by a trained service dog. Emotional support animals, comfort animals and therapy animals are not considered service animals by the ADA and are not permitted in the theater.

Sensory-Friendly Performances

◆ **Adapted** for individuals on the autism spectrum, those with sensory sensitivity or anyone who may benefit from a relaxed theater experience, performances will feature:

- Modified technical elements like lighting and sound
- Activity areas with live video feed of the show and sensory fidgets for those who'd like to take a break from the theater setting
- Social Narratives to prepare audience members for their trip to the theater
- A judgment-free environment where patrons may vocalize, react and move about as they wish
- Seating area flexibility so audience members may leave and re-enter the seating area as needed

◆ New Victory is partnering with Seats on the Spectrum to provide a more inclusive experience for neurodivergent patrons. Check out the seat map on NewVictory.org for Autism-Friendly Seating designated for families who would benefit from seating near auditorium exits.
